

#### **Basics**


- Australians can participate in almost every aspect of FP7 / Horizon2020
  - Marie Curie Actions (IRSES, ITN, IIF)
  - ERC (as international team members)
  - Cooperation (as full partners)
- Cooperation funding: a Community financial contribution may be granted provided that it is essential for carrying out the indirect action



## Strategy

- KBBE, Health & ICT are very international
  - Download ICT capability analysis of Australia from SECAS project www.secas.eu
- Consider niche expertise:
  - Advanced composites (NMP)
  - Hypersonics (Transport)
  - Social innovation (SSH)
  - Border protection (Security)
  - Fusion (Euratom)

#### **Tactics**

- Academic & public
  - Established researcher networks trust
  - Experienced researchers
  - Consider request for EC funds
- Large business
  - Normally via European subsidiary
- SME
  - Difficult (cost, time, administration)
  - Consider also including local university
  - R&D Tax Incentive one of the most generous

## Final tips

- Include travel budget for Australians
- Use proposal agreements that protect the Australian's IP
- Encourage the Australian partners to involve their admin/management staff early
- Exposure, networks & training!
